Our chance to shine!

Schools in California are rated on the performance of students on the CAHSEE and STAR tests. The STAR tests are comprised of tests in English/Language Arts; Math; Science; Social Science and a test for all sophomore (Grade 10) students in general science. The tests are grade level based (i.e.

English/Language Arts) or subject based (i.e.

Algebra 2 for students currently or the past summer enrolled in Algebra 2).

Results from the STAR test is the major component in determining a school's ranking and performance in comparison with all of the high schools in the state of California. Although AHS has a strong academic reputation, the future value of an AHS diploma requires continuous growth and high ranking in the state. In the last four years, AHS has grown 51 points for an overall API score of 859. Our goal is to continue our overall improvement as a school and to demonstrate the excellence that our students exhibit every day.

STAR Testing will take place on April 21, 22, and 23rd. Your children should have a good breakfast and come to school well rested on the days of STAR Testing. Please encourage them to continue their good work and demonstrate their excellent knowledge on all of the STAR Tests.

California State PTA Responds to State Budget and Advocates Finance Reform

California State PTA President Pam Brady issued the following statement on February 20 in response to the budget adopted by state lawmakers and signed by the Governor.

"This budget does not value the children of California. Instead, it puts an entire generation of children - and the state's very future - at risk.

"Some new revenues are part of this budget, and for that we acknowledge the Governor and legislators for recognizing the need to take a balanced approach to the state's budget crisis. Even so, the severe cuts that are included in the final budget threaten our state's commitment to a world-class education.

"These cuts are almost certainly going to drive California - already a dismal 47th - to the bottom among all states in per-pupil spending. That means cutting teachers, arts, classroom materials, counselors, nurses, small class sizes, and much more that children need to succeed in school and life.

"California cannot afford to go backward in its commitment to children and students, especially in challenging economic times.

"In the coming weeks, we will continue to analyze the details of the budget package, including several statewide initiatives that will be placed on the May 19 ballot as part of the budget deal.

"And California State PTA will continue to advocate for legislators and the Governor to develop a farsighted budget plan and process - a plan with vision, a plan that is a reflection of the hopes and dreams of the next generation, and a plan that is truly focused on the future of our state."

On February 23, more than 100 PTA leaders gathered in Sacramento for their annual legislative conference, met with legislators and invited them into the schools throughout California to see how the new budget hurts children.

"The PTA believes the smartest economic recovery plan is to invest in children," Brady said.

Announcing the first step in a campaign to fix the economic gridlock, the PTA calls for:

- Removal of the 2/3 majority vote of the legislature to pass a budget;
- Lowering the threshold to pass local parcel taxes to a supermajority of 55 percent; and

Restructuring California's school finance system.

"No one should be proud of a budget that drops funding for schools to dead last in the nation," Brady said.

"All children should have arts, small class sizes, counselors, nurses, librarians, and yes - textbooks - and this budget forces communities to fight over crumbs," Brady said.

Reminder:

Summer is around the corner and students should start thinking about their summer plans. ROP is now busy planning our summer program for students who are 16 years or junior, senior. Incoming sophomore students are allowed enrollment in specific ROP classes which is indicated by an asterisk next to the class title. The following classes will be offered: Computer Programming C++*, Computer Program JAVA*, Culinary Arts, Digital Photography*, Retail Marketing, Retail Sales (work experience). Enrollment will begin at lunch on Monday, March 23rd in the ROP office P-12; classes are **FREE** to high school students. Space is limited and because of high demand, enrollment is based on a first come first serve basis. Gain a valuable skill and earn some credits towards graduation at the same time.

Something to consider in finding your career:

Get a job or do some volunteer work in your community. A part-time job can teach you many valuable skills you will later need in a career. Work Permit Reminder:

If you have a student under 18 years old who is currently working, the law requires that he/she have a work permit. Work permit applications can be obtained in the ROP office P-12 and are **FREE**.

COUNSELORS' CORNER

Seniors

Points of interest for the last months of school:

April

Watch the mail for college acceptance and financial aid award letters. Compare the financial aid awards you receive from various colleges.

Check with the college you've chosen to attend about the details of signing and returning your financial aid award letter.

Watch for important deadlines at your chosen college (housing, financial aid, etc).

Make your final decision and send in a deposit by the deadline.

Notify the schools that you will not be attending of your final decision.

May

Advanced Placement (AP) exams are given in high schools nationwide. Make sure to send your AP grade report to your college.

If you have not received a notice regarding your Cal Grant application from the CA Student Aid Commission, contact them at 1-888-CAGrant as soon as possible.

May 1 is usually the deadline for notifying colleges of your decision.

Submit on-campus college housing forms and payment.

June/July

Submit request for your final transcript to be sent through docufide to the college you will be attending in the fall (as well as to the NCAA Clearinghouse for Div I or Div II athletes).

Notify the college you will be attending of any private scholarships or grants you will be

receiving.

Know when the payment for tuition, room and board meal plans etc. are due.

PARENTS: Don't forget to take your child to the doctor for a complete physical and immunizations.

Senioritis

Senioritis is a drop in motivation common among senior students at this time of year. Parents need to be aware of the symptoms which include procrastination, lack of focus and slipping grades. If you observe these behaviors in your student, we recommend that you stay in contact with their teachers and closely monitor their daily attendance through the ISIS system. Instructions on signing up for the ISIS program can be found in the Academic Success section of this newsletter.

Attendance is critical during the second semester of the senior year. **All students are expected to attend regularly.** Good attendance contributes directly to good grades. Poor attendance can result in missed assignments, missed exams, and poor grades. Most students need to pass every class in order to graduate, and **MUST** pass the state mandated English and Government/Economics courses. **Also, seniors who are already 18 years of age may be involuntarily transferred to an alternate educational setting for poor attendance.**

Admissions offices of four-year colleges expect seniors to maintain their GPA. D's and F's in required college prep courses make students ineligible for college admission. A significant lowering of GPA may result in colleges rescinding a previous offer of acceptance.

COUNSELORS' CORNER

In most cases, students who are short credits after the first semester of the senior year have the opportunity to make up those credits at the Arcadia Adult School second semester.

However, there is no opportunity to make up credits lost during the second semester of the senior year and still be eligible to participate in graduation activities, including the graduation ceremony. The Arcadia High School graduation policy states:

Students must complete 225 credits, as well as pass Algebra 1, the health requirement, the swim survival requirement and the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) in order to earn an Arcadia High School diploma. If a student ends the senior year short credits for graduation, he/she will be given 18 months in which to make up not more than 15 credits at the Arcadia Adult School to obtain an Arcadia High School diploma.

Please help your child stay focused and finish strong. The single most important factor for a student's academic success is parent support. As always, we are here to support your student with their personal, academic and career/college needs.

For Juniors Only

ATTENTION ALL JUNIORS: NOW is the time to start finalizing your College Application plans. Use this time now and over the summer to do your *final* research on colleges you would like to attend. Consider all variables including location, transportation, major, financial situation, 'match' for your GPA and SAT/ACT scores, etc. You should be applying to one REACH school, a REALISTIC school, and a 'safety' school – one that you will most likely get into to. Consider if you really want to attend a private university vs. one of the very fine public universities right here in the state of California. Our own statistics and data show that many of our students apply to as many as 20 schools – including private universities, UC's and Cal States. This is a tremendous waste of energy and resources (not to mention – just a waste of money) – when you are already quite certain you'll stay in California and go to a Public School. It is best to apply only to private schools that you truly will attend, if you are admitted. Have you visited each school that you want to apply to? Do you know what the school has to offer you? Students who 'OVER-APPLY' (apply to a whole bunch of schools just to see if they can they get in) are actually skewing the numbers for AHS Students. Most private Universities get to know trends from high schools across the country, and we do not want AHS to be a high school from which students apply – but never enroll. Those schools will stop accepting our students. So please, think critically and carefully about the schools to which you will apply for admissions – and make sure you are a good match before you go through the entire application and decision making process.

COUNSELORS' CORNER

You will save yourself time, energy, worry, stress; and you will help yourself and all of AHS in the long run.

The [2009-2010](#) Student Data Packet is now available online. All Juniors who will be requesting a Counselor letter of recommendation for private colleges and scholarships next school year MUST fill out the Student Data Packet. Students must complete and turn in the Student data Packet forms by Sept. 25, 2009. Students who turn their Packet in early report that they have a 'jump-start' on the college application process. These students are grateful to have a very large task out of the way when they are filling out college applications. The Student Data Packet is found on the school website: www.ausd.net/ahs. Click on Counseling, then click on College Information and then on [2009-2010](#) Student Data Packet. Please do this and turn it in to the Career Center (Room P13) by Sept. 25th, 2009.

Since the forms are electronic, you will fill in the blanks by typing responses, or you will use a drop-down menu when available. We encourage you to print out a copy of the form and answer questions off-line first. You can then put your answers into a WORD document and then copy and paste into the on-line form in one sitting. Data input into the form cannot be saved and retrieved for later editing.

Please be advised that all requests for private college recommendations from the counseling staff will be due according to the following schedule:

Regular Decision College Application Deadlines: [October 1, 2009](#) – [October 30, 2009](#); \$10 processing fee – includes an official transcript

Penalty for Late Requests: \$20 processing fee for each official transcript which is requested late.

Early Decision College Application Deadlines: Counselors must receive a minimum of 4 weeks advanced notice (not including holidays) prior to the deadline. For example, students applying to colleges with a November 1st Early Decision Deadline, must submit their request for letters of recommendation by October 1st.

STUDENT SERVICES OFFICE

THEFTS. Arcadia High school is a good school with the clear majority of students focusing on doing what is right and what is ethical. Unfortunately we do have some students that engage in activities that affect others negatively. One of these activities involves stealing valuable items such as IPODS, Cell Phones and Wallets. In the past I have mentioned that students have taken items out of lockers, many times when they are not locked, as well as backpacks that are left unattended. Recently we have had a few students whose items were taken out of the back of their backpacks when they are walking down the hall.

Please make your son/daughter aware of this and emphasize to them the importance of keeping their valuable items on their person such as in a pocket. When we have enough information regarding any thefts we do investigate.

We have certain legal guidelines we must follow when investigating a theft. In order to search a student we have to have reasonable suspicion. Therefore, if there is no reasonable suspicion we can not search a student. The reason I am explaining this is because there are instances in which we have received requests to search every student in a classroom when property has been taken. We cannot do this without reasonable suspicion. Therefore, when there is no reasonable suspicion we are not able to take action. It is not because we don't care or can't be bothered it is because we have certain legal guidelines we must follow.

If your son or daughter has an item taken on campus they should come to our office, J 9 ½, to complete a report with as much information as possible. The serial number or other unique identification is especially helpful. The reason for completing the report is that sometimes these items turn up later, sometimes even in another investigation.

SENIORS. Parents, if you have a senior daughter or son you know they are in the home stretch of their high school career. Remind them that senioritis is not an excuse for failing a course or violating school rules. It is especially difficult when a senior fails a class and therefore is not eligible to graduate or violates a rule and loses the privilege of participating in senior activities such as prom or grad night. Unfortunately, in my many years working in high schools it seems that at least one student each year receives the consequences I described above. It would be awesome if that did not occur this year.

Mr. Kerney, Ms. Mackessey and I wish you and your son/daughter our best as we close in on the end of the school year.
