PSAT

The **PSAT/NMSQT** will be given at Arcadia High School on **Saturday, October 17, 2009** to any juniors, sophomores, and freshmen who sign up. This test determines the juniors who will qualify as National Merit Scholarship Semi Finalists in their senior year.

Students' PSAT test booklets will be returned along with the test results in January 2010 giving all students a great opportunity to not only see their scores but also your student's work for additional study.

Student **Sign Ups** for the PSAT will be during lunch only, in front of the Music Building, next school year, from September 21 through October 2. Students need to remember to bring a photo ID to sign up for this test. We encourage all juniors, sophomores and freshmen to sign up and take this important test.

The cost of the test will be \$30.00 per student and checks should be made out to "Arcadia Music Club." Late sign-ups as well as walk-ins on the day of the test will be charged \$40.00.

Reflections

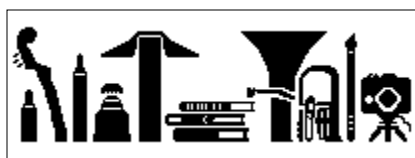
Art Contest

STUDENT SERVICES OFFICE

Welcome to the 2009/2010 school year. The Student/Parent Services office is located in the J Building which is the two story building adjacent to the softball field on Campus Drive. The office includes the following members of the Arcadia High School Staff:

The Student Services Office is responsible for the following areas: school safety, school discipline, attendance, emergency plan, specific academic departments (listed above), assisting the Opportunity Program, Permits and Guardianship.

Our philosophy in regards to discipline focuses on prevention. There have been many instances in which students or parents have informed us of a potential issue and we have been able to meet with the students potentially involved and prevent the issue from occurring which kept that student from violating rules and getting themselves into trouble. Your and your student's assistance in this area is greatly appreciated.

Unfortunately there are many times that we have students violate school rules and the education code. We are always working to do what is best for all students, not just the student who committed the violation. When the behavior involves violation of the education code or criminal code the student may be suspended, involuntarily transferred, or expelled from school and also could face criminal charges. Regardless of the situation, our goal is to assist your student in making better choices in the future. These are difficult times for students, parents and school staff. Difficult decisions are made that may not satisfy all parties involved. Please understand that we are not making a judgment of students or parents. We are focusing on the violation and resulting consequences that are necessary in a school setting to provide an appropriate learning environment. We are here to help you as you continue to work with your student to be successful in his/her development.

It is important for you and your student to read the planner/handbook that each student receives at the beginning of the school year. The information included in the handbook portion of the planner includes the discipline matrix as well as some basic rules and expectations.

Attendance

Tardies. The construction of a state of the art educational facility is underway. It is exciting to see the work begin with anticipation for students having a new, impressive facility. While we

work towards this goal there are always some changes we have to endure. In this case it is the limited parking. Due to this, most students will be parking off campus. Traffic will be more congested the closer we get to the daily start of school. If students don't manage their time well there is a greater possibility they will be late to class.

The construction and resulting parking limitations and traffic is not an excuse for students to be late to class. It is important that students manage their time so that they can get to class on time. That may require some students to leave for school a few minutes earlier than they have in the past. It is important that all students are on time to class each period. Tardy sweeps will be conducted at varied times throughout the year to reinforce the need for students to be on time to class.

When a student is cited during a tardy sweep they will serve lunch detention that day (if it happens prior to lunch) or the next day (if it occurs after lunch). Failure to attend the assigned detention results in assignment of after school detention for the following day which lasts one hour from the time the student begins the after school detention.

Absences. It is important that you call in the day your student is absent and, when they return, send a note with them to turn in to the attendance office. When students return from an absence it is important that they arrive at school earlier than usual so that they can turn their note into attendance to get their readmit. This should be done before school and will not be accepted as an excuse for a tardy to class.

Dropoff and Pickup. Dropoff and pickup should not be done in school parking lots. When cars dropoff and pickup students in these areas it creates a dangerous situation and contributes to further congestion.

Skateboards, Razor Scooters and Bicycles. These can not be used on school grounds. Students must walk them or carry them while on campus.

Electronic Devices. Students are not allowed to use electronic devices in class. This includes cell phones. It is important for students to turn off their cell phone during class. If it rings during class it may be confiscated by the teacher. The teacher will then turn it into our office and a parent will have to be present in order for the cell phone to be returned.

Personal Items. Students are responsible for their personal items. Do not leave them unattended. A recommendation is that students keep all valuables such as money, wallets and electronic devices on their person, not in backpacks. I would also recommend students not carry a large amount of cash. There may be instances where a student has to. If that is the case, keep that private. Do not show others. That attracts the wrong attention.

Students should not be buying and selling items to each other on campus. Students who purchase a stolen item, even without knowledge of it being stolen, are in violation of Education Code and Criminal Law. When the cost of the item is below normal prices there is a chance it is a stolen item.

REGIONAL OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM ROP

Arcadia High School's Regional Occupational Program (ROP) offers classes to students during the day and it also offers classes to students and adults during the afternoons, evenings, and Saturday.

Employability Training Skills: Every ROP class conducts job search workshops that provide information on topics such as personal development, resume preparation, employment applications, interviewing techniques and networking.

ROP CLASS REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS: Sophomore/Junior/Seniors. Students can register in the ROP Office, P 12. Students receive high school credit for attending ROP classes and many are UC approved courses. There are no fees for high school students.

During Apache days the ROP office, P-12 will be open for registration, information and work permits.

What is Work Experience? To earn high school credit for your job, students must be employed and attend class on Tuesday 3-5:30 p.m. The amount of high school elective credit (5/10) is determined by the average number of hours worked each week.

Students will learn customer relations, career advancement, safe work habits, tax preparation and terminology used in industry. All students enrolled in the class will be issued an extended work permit which allows students to work a more flexible work schedule.

What is a work permit? A work permit is a legal document required by the state of California that allows a person under 18 years to hold a job. An employer who hires a minor must have the work permit on file at the business site before the minor may start the job. **Work permits can be obtained in the ROP office, P12 and are FREE.**

To get or keep a work permit, must I attend school? The answer is YES! Requiring work permits for minors insure that they stay in school, which requires parent or guardian permission to work.

At what age can I get a work permit? In most cases, students must be at least 14 years of age to get a work permit with the exception of "entertainment work permit" that can be given from infants to 18 years. Although 14 and 15 year olds may get work permits, most employers will not hire students under age 16. This is because the workers' compensation insurance usually does not cover workers under the age 16.

How often do I need to get a work permit? Each time a minor is hired for a new job, a new work permit must be obtained and given to the employer.

ASVAB Testing: On Tuesday, October 20th from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. ROP will be hosting the Armed Services Vocational Battery (ASVAB) assessment for any junior or senior. Administered **FREE** of charge, no studying or special preparation is required. The Department of Defense sponsors the ASVAB and it is a career exploration program that is designed to help the student learn more about themselves and explore occupations in line with their interests and skills. Taking the test explains the student's strengths and helps identify where improvements may be needed. The ASVAB consists of nine short tests. Areas such as general science, arithmetic reasoning, work knowledge, paragraph comprehension, mathematics knowledge, electronics information, auto & shop information, mechanical comprehension and assembling objects are measured by the assessment. In approximately six weeks, the Department of Defense will interpret the assessment with the results given to the students. **We are now taking enrollments in the ROP office, P 12.**

About School to Career: School-to-Career is an educational initiative that provides students of all ages with a wide range of educational and career development options. The goal of School-to-Career is to make classroom learning more relevant, inspiring students to commit themselves to life-long learning and preparing them for successful, high-skill, well-paid careers within today's competitive job market.

ROP Office (P12) has:

Job Book- contains employment opportunities from local community business. If you are or have a business that would like to hire an Arcadia High School student, please give us a call (626) 821-8370, ext.1104, and we will be glad to include your request.

Sample Resume Book- contains various resume samples for students to use as a guide.

Internship/Volunteer Book- consists of non-paid opportunities for students in many private and public agencies throughout the San Gabriel Valley.

Work Permits

Remember: All work permits issued during the 2008-2009 school year and summer will expire on August 31st 2009. If you are under 18 years of age and employed, you must obtain or renew a work permit. Work permit applications will be available in P-12, ROP office during Apache days.

Parent Support Groups at AHS??

Were you aware that a number of parent support groups exist at AHS? This may prompt you to ask the question “why?” You may also wonder what is the purpose for such groups when there is already a well established and committed *Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA)*.

The best way to explain the existence of these groups is to say that PTSA is like the mother of the various parent ethnic groups, and the various parent ethnic groups that exist are like the offspring. As parents we all know only too well that each child is unique even though as a family there is much we share in common. Similarly, there is much that is shared in common between PTSA and the various parent ethnic groups. The groups are united in their goal to provide a safe and academically encouraging environment for our children at AHS. PTSA, as the head of the various parent ethnic groups, serves as the leader and liaison between parents, school administration (teachers included) and students. It obtains first-hand important information on school policies, curriculum and activities at AHS and at the school district level. Additionally, any cultural issues that may affect a child’s education or a parent’s understanding of the curriculum and resources available for their child’s education can be addressed at meetings of these parent ethnic support groups.

Let us always keep in mind that we are **one school community**. Let us embrace any differences and gain momentum and strength from that which we have in common. **Let us work together for the common good of our children’s education!**
