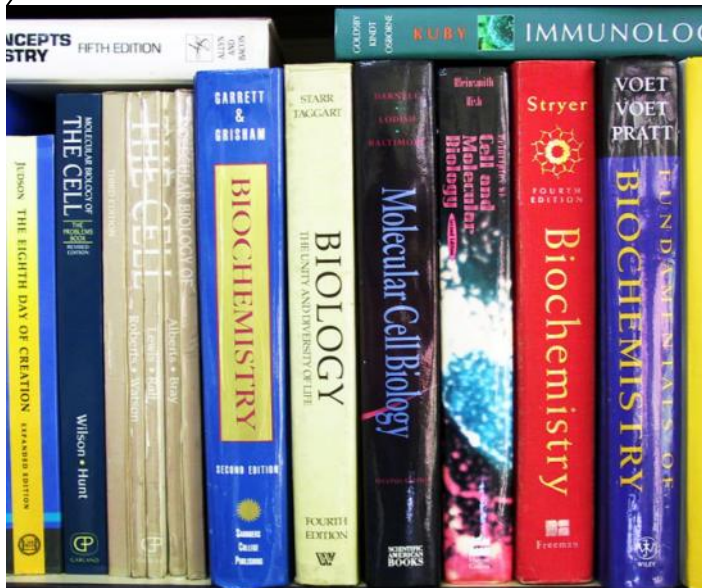

AEF Update



The Arcadia Educational Foundation (AEF) is a non-profit organization that was founded in 1981 by parents and community volunteer members committed to preserving academic excellence in the Arcadia Unified School District (AUSD). Over the last thirty years, the Foundation has contributed to a wide range of instructional materials, computers, science lab renovations, teacher enrichment grants, college scholarships for students, musical instruments, and library media centers for AUSD.

Although the work of AEF has always been important, today we are facing an unprecedented financial crisis for our schools, and AEF's mission is more crucial than ever. Since the 2007-2008 school year, the district has suffered a \$17 million loss in state funding. Through conservative fiscal management and the use of one-time only funds, the district has been able to buffer our students from any real impact to their education. Sadly, this is no longer the case. In addition to this previous loss of revenue, and because our State legislators have been unable to come to a budget agreement, Arcadia schools will now face an additional \$3.1 million cut for next year.

These budget cuts threaten the very things that make our schools what they are. If we are not able to make up the shortfall from the State, we will face:

- Teacher layoffs
- Further increases in class size (e.g., class size for first through third grade will increase to 24 to 1)
- Up to five days less of teaching time
- Reduction in student counselors
- Reduction/elimination of enrichment programs (e.g., AP classes, elective classes, performing arts program, GATE

- program)
- Reduction in administrative and staff support
- Reduction in academic year intervention programs
- Elimination of State-funded intervention programs at all levels

So far, AEF has raised \$300,000 and given the district \$280,000 - the equivalent of 4 teacher salaries. We are now working towards a fifth salary. We would like to express our heartfelt thanks to the AHS ASB students who have initiated a Million Dollar Campaign. It is so impressive to see students, many of them 12th graders, place such a high value on their education. We are all eager to see if parents and community members will rise to the challenge made by our students.

Please join AEF in the fight to keep our schools great. Each one of us is responsible for maintaining the educational and community environment that brought us to Arcadia in the first place. AEF holds monthly meetings at the district office on the 2nd Wednesday of the month. For more information on what you can do to help, please go to the AEF website at <http://aef.ausd.net/site/>. In the meantime, every time you buy SCRIP, you support AHS and AEF. You can also give to AEF by shopping at Amazon. A percentage of all purchases made through the link goes to AEF to raise money for the school district at no additional cost to you; and the more we shop, the higher the percentage! SENIORS

Points of interest for the last months of school:

May

- Watch for important deadlines at your chosen college (housing, financial aid, etc).
- Advanced Placement (AP) exams are given in high schools nationwide. Make sure to send your AP grade report to your college.
- If you have not received a notice regarding your Cal Grant application from the CA Student Aid Commission, contact them at 1-888-CAGrant as soon as possible.
- May 1st is usually the deadline for notifying colleges of your decision.
- Submit on-campus college housing forms and payment.

June/July

- Submit request for your final transcript to be sent through docufide (www.docufide.com) to the college you will be attending in the fall (as well as to the NCAA Clearinghouse for Div I or Div II athletes).
- Notify the college you will be attending of any private scholarships or grants you will be receiving.
- Know when the payment for tuition, room and board, meal plans, etc. are due.
- PARENTS: Don't forget to take your child to the doctor for a complete physical and immunizations.

Counselors' Corner

SENIORITIS

Senioritis is a drop in motivation common among senior students

at this time of year. Parents need to be aware of the symptoms which include procrastination, lack of focus, and slipping grades. If you observe these behaviors in your student, we recommend that you stay in contact with their teachers and closely monitor their daily attendance through the ISIS system. Instructions on signing up for the ISIS program can be found in the Academic Success section of the Curriculum Guide.

Attendance is critical during the second semester of the senior year. **All students are expected to attend regularly.** Good attendance contributes directly to good grades. Poor attendance can result in missed assignments, missed exams, and poor grades. Most students need to pass every class in order to graduate and **MUST** pass the state mandated English and Government/Economics courses. **Also, seniors who are already 18 years of age may be involuntarily transferred to an alternate educational setting for poor attendance.**

Admissions offices of four-year colleges expect seniors to maintain their GPA. "D"s and "F"s in required college prep courses make students ineligible for college admission. A significant lowering of GPA may result in colleges rescinding a previous offer of acceptance.

Counselors' Corner (Cont'd)

In most cases, students who are short credits after the first semester of the senior year have the opportunity to make up those credits at the

Arcadia Adult School in second semester. However, there is no opportunity to make up credits lost during the second semester of the senior year and still be eligible to participate in graduation activities, including the graduation ceremony. The Arcadia High School graduation policy states:

Students must complete 225 credits, as well as pass Algebra 1, the health requirement, the swim survival requirement, and the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) in order to earn an Arcadia High School diploma. If a student ends the senior year short credits for graduation, he/she will be given 18 months in which to make up not more than 15 credits at the Arcadia Adult School to obtain an Arcadia High School diploma.

Please help your child stay focused and finish strong. The single most important factor for a student's academic success is parent support. As always, we are here to support your student with their personal, academic, and career/college needs.

JUNIORS

Now is the time to start narrowing your list of colleges to which you will apply to in the

fall of your senior year. Final research on colleges you would like to attend and visits to schools should be done now and over the summer.

Consider all variables:

- Location
- Major
- Public or private
- College size
- Transportation
- Financial situation
- "Match" for your GPA and SAT/ACT scores

You should be applying to one "reach" school, which would be considered a stretch for you, a "realistic" school, which is a solid match for you based on your GPA and test scores, and one "safety" school, where you will be a top applicant. Students who over apply (e.g., applying to schools just to see if they can get in) are actually skewing the numbers for other AHS students. Most private universities get to know trends from high schools across the country. We do not want AHS to be a high school from which students apply but never enroll. Those schools will stop accepting our students. So please, think critically and carefully about the schools to which you will apply for admissions. Make certain you are a good match before you go through the entire application and decision-making process. You will save yourself time, energy, and stress; and you will help yourself and all of AHS in the long run. A good rule of thumb is to apply only to private schools that you truly will attend if admitted.

Counselors' Corner (Cont'd)

COLLEGE KNOWLEDGE WORKSHOP

All Juniors who anticipate needing a counselor letter of recommendation next year for private colleges or scholarships should attend the College Knowledge Workshop on Wednesday, May 25th, at 3:00 p.m. in the Science Lecture Hall. At the workshop, counselors will describe the timeline for the entire application process, highlighting important details on requesting the letters of recommendation, and completing a personal Student Data Packet. A student data packet must be completed in order to request a counselor letter of recommendation and will be available online at <http://counseling.ahs.ausd.net> (click on College Information).

Please be advised that all requests for private college recommendations and scholarships from the counseling department must adhere to specific deadlines and processing fees listed in the Curriculum Guide on page 6. Counselors must receive a minimum of 4 weeks advanced notice (not including holidays) prior to the deadline. For students applying Early Decision with a November 1st deadline, requests for a letter of recommendation must be submitted by October 1st. For any deadlines prior to October 1st, 2011, students must submit their requests for a letter of recommendation by June 3, 2011.

Work Permit Reminder:

If you are a student under 18 years old who is currently working, the law requires that he/she have a work permit (even during summer). Work permit applications can be obtained in the Career Center/ROP office and are free. The ROP office will be processing work permits during the summer on a limited basis. The office hours will vary and will be posted outside the Career Center/ROP office. Please allow 24 hours to process your work permit.

Volunteer

Volunteering is one activity where you get back more than you give. Volunteering is a way to make a difference. Being a volunteer helps make life better for everybody: the people you help, your community, your family, and yourself.

Also, you may have heard that volunteer experience is a plus on your college applications. Keep in mind, though, that colleges are not just looking for a list of organizations and dates. They want to see a complete picture of you, and real examples of your commitment, dedication, and interests. Colleges like to see your dedication to one or two activities than to see that you have spread yourself too thin.

- Gain valuable life experiences and skills
- Meet interesting people
- Send signal to colleges

The ROP office has a volunteer book which list places in the community looking for student helpers. Check with programs in your community; call and ask if they need help. Check with public libraries, local hospitals, your city recreation department, and your church or synagogue for projects that might need help.

YOUR CALENDAR SHOULD HAVE THESE DATES NOTED!

Apache Days for the 2011-2012 SCHOOL YEAR will be August 16th – 22nd! Seniors will register on Tuesday, August 16th, Juniors on Wednesday, August 17th, Sophomores on Thursday, August 18th, and Freshmen on Friday, August 19th. Make-up Day for all grade levels is Monday, August 22nd. Keep those days free to take care of business at Arcadia High School! AHS families will be receiving passwords from Arcadia Unified School District the first week of August. Using these passwords, families are required to fill out two District forms – the Annual Notification to Parents and the Emergency Contact Form. Each form has a signature page which must be printed out and signed by the parent. Bring these two forms to Apache Days along with the rest of the Apache Day Packet. We have been doing this since your child started Arcadia High School.

When you complete the district forms, you MUST continue online to the high school site. These forms must be completed, printed out, and signed BEFORE you come to Apache Days. If you do not bring these forms, you will not be allowed to start the registration process. If you do not have access to a computer and cannot get to the Arcadia Public Library prior to your scheduled registration time to access a computer, please arrange to come to Arcadia High School with a parent to complete your paperwork in the computer lab. Filling out the online forms will take a full hour, so please allow for time to complete these forms before your scheduled registration time. Please make sure your parent brings all the emergency contact information, insurance form numbers, and identification materials necessary to fill out all the forms. On July 1st, there must be proof of immunization of the tDap in your student's file prior to the 2011-2012 school year. If your student does not bring their proof, s/he will NOT

be going through the registration process. This translates to: s/he will NOT be attending school until s/he has an immunization and the immunization record is recorded at school. Please bring proof of vaccination to the school health office as soon as possible to avoid this delay in registration.

For our new students, an explanation of Apache Days...every year, during the five days of registration, thousands of students (over 95%) are able to pay their fees, get their schedules and books, and begin the process of orienting back to our campus. There will be more than 300 parent volunteers for the entire process. Please be timely, fill out the forms, bring this year's school ID (save it over the summer), and bring a backpack for your books. Thanks to our efficient volunteers and staff, no student should take longer than 2 hours to register during Apache Days!

In advance, we would also like to say a big THANK YOU to all the parents who say "yes" when they are contacted to help! It takes over 300 volunteers to make this event a success. Apache Day volunteers are such a valuable resource, we appreciate your participation! WE will be needing your help, so please contact us ASAP if you are available to volunteer for a 3-hour shift. Let us know what day and time (morning or afternoon), you can work. A perk for your student if you volunteer to help is that s/he will get a First-in-Line and a "Fast Pass" for the 2 impacted contact points. We will also need volunteers on the first morning of the school year, August 29th, at 6:45 a.m. until 10:00ish. Thank you for all of your time in assisting our students when we welcome all back to AHS! So email us, sign-up, and we wish you a terrific summer!
